INSPECTIONS

Every year the town contracts weed inspectors as per the Alberta Weed Control Act. These inspectors are charged to work their way through town, both public and private lands, to find noxious weeds. If they find these weeds they are then tasked to inform the town and the private citizens what the next steps need to be.

The inspectors are given permission to enter private land by way of the Alberta Weed Control Act. They will typically only do so if they have noticed noxious weeds from passing by your yard, or have received a request to inspect. Please check our [website](#) for more information.
