Property tax notices were mailed out on June 13th. Not receiving your statement does not constitute non-payment. If you have not received your notice please reach out to town office for your copy. All property taxes are due September 30 unless you're enrolled in TIPPs.

Town Office Closure

Town office and all indoor facilities will be closed for the August long weekend on Monday Aug 1, 2022. We will reopen on Tuesday Aug 2.

Water Restrictions:

The town of Black Diamond is currently on Level 2 watering restrictions. All outdoor water use including watering lawns, non-commercial washing of vehicles, sidewalks, pads, exteriors of building, filling of hot tubs/jacuzzi, recreational use of sprinklers and like water toys, is restricted to: odd number addresses may water Thursday and Sunday; even number addresses Wed & Sat; 6am-9am 7pm-10pm

Work has begun on the **mountain bike** trail for the 2023 Summer Games that Black Diamond and Okotoks have teamed up on. Thanks to an agreement in place with the Turner Valley Golf Course to use their private land, we have been able to work towards this great recreational piece for our community. There has been a lot of excitement from the local youth and many parents about this track since it will allow just one more fun activity for the kids to keep them active. We appreciate the golf course allowing us the opportunity to use their land for the community. We want to remind everyone to treat it with respect.



There have also been concerns voiced regarding the work from an environmental stand point. We absolutely have heard these concerns and have done everything we can in order to minimize environmental impact as much as possible and still create a safe and usable trail. As regrowth occurs along the edges of the pathway the trail width will decrease and become less noticeable.

We are currently looking for volunteers for handwork to help groom and finish the trail to make it usable for the last part of the summer. The machinery could only do so much, and with the community's help, we hope to get things done quickly. We will gather on August 13, starting at 8 am at the SSSR. Pump Track Expansion: The pump track located south of the SSSR has been expanded! We are currently waiting on some finishing supplies to be delivered, and Pettersen Contracting will be able to finish the last of the work.

The ORA ice will be made over the next few weeks, and we will be officially open for ice rentals at the end of August. Skateboard park groundwork should start the first week of August as long as everything goes as planned. Once the groundwork begins, it typically only takes a few days. After the groundwork is complete, we will have Transition come in to start the pouring process. Please be mindful of all the construction around the recreation site outside the arena.

Be sure to stay safe out on the water around town! The pathways right along the river's edge have become unstable due to the high waters; be aware when adventuring. While floating be prepared for dangers including but not limited to fallen trees, currents, alcohol, heat, low waters (tail bone injuries, drowning and pet safety).

Outside on the SSSR, we still have pickleball on Mondays and Wednesdays; the pad is available for skating, basketball, floor hockey etc., throughout the rest of the days unless privately booked. Kidney March, the 3-day, 100KM walk from Kananaskis to Calgary, will pass near the Town of Black Diamond, walking in the neighbouring Town of Turner Valley on September 9, as marchers kick off their epic journey.

In support of The Kidney Foundation of Canada, this is the 13th year for Kidney March, the only event of its kind to fight kidney disease and for organ donation.

Marchers walk an average of 33KM a day to raise needed awareness and vital funds for kidney disease prevention, life-saving research, patient programs and organ donation initiatives. KidneyMarch

Ingredients

- Highland Beef sirloin or round roast (thawed)
- 1 onion
- 60 ml red wine (can purchase non-alcoholic varieties at AG)
- Salt and Pepper
- 100 ml beef stock
- Fresh herbs (rosemary is most common; Nick is a fan of using summer savoury or sage)

Directions

- Preheat oven to 230c/450 F season beef with salt and pepper
- Sear cut end in hot pan (Nick uses cast iron w/cultured butter) it allows the beef to stay nice and juicy through cooking
- Add sliced onion, red wine, and beef stock in bottom of oven pan, lay beef on top and sprinkle with fresh herbs roast for 30-40 min for medium rare, baste 2-3 times with juices while cooking
- Remove from oven/pan cover loosely with foil let rest 20 min
- Serve with fresh garden vegetables
- Remember to drizzle with the amazing juices left in the pan.
- Whisk in corn starch to thicken for a gravy
