Financial Planning and Budget Discussions Underway

The 2023 Town of Diamond Valley budget process has started. On March 1, Council was presented and approved the *2023 Financial Plan* consisting of the Operating and Capital Budget Assumptions and Guidelines. These documents provide key economic and financial indicators and are the starting point for the budgetary process.

Over the course of the next eight weeks, Council and administration will work together to execute the strategic priorities and make key financial decisions with the development of the 2023 Financial Plan. This will involve the 2023 Budget and the 2024 – 2026 Projected Forecast. As well, a robust 2023 – 2028 Capital Budget will be prepared along with a Ten-Year Capital Plan that will allow the Town to plan for large capital/infrastructure projects. This will be the first financial plan for the amalgamated Town of Diamond Valley.

Mayor's Message

The days are getting longer, and we've almost made it to spring, however we will still have snowfalls and icy conditions to contend with, no doubt. Remember to shovel your sidewalks as soon as possible after a snowfall, and to deposit the snow into your yard, not onto the street. If you are able to, please offer to help neighbours to keep up with snow clearing tasks. Our community pride is built by the actions and work we put into it. Thank you for keeping the sidewalks in your neighbourhood safe for everyone to use.

The big question has been, how has amalgamation been coming along? Well, I can tell you that overall, Council is super happy with the progress made thus far by staff, and public support throughout the transition has been fantastic. The Public Works department has been amazing; the combination of good equipment and staff expertise has proven itself on the streets of Diamond Valley. We have been out clearing and sanding areas that have been hard to reach in the past, and we are now able to achieve an excellent level of service consistently. Council will soon be reviewing the snow and ice removal policy while it is fresh in mind, to try and address some of the more problematic areas. The office staff have been busy aligning processes and departments and finding efficiencies to reduce duplication. Council and administration will continue to work to align bylaws, policies, and processes as we blend the two systems into one high-functioning unit.

Council members have been given their committee appointments for the year, and we continue to meet on the first and third Wednesdays of the month at 6:30pm. We presently meet at the main office in the former Black Diamond; however, Council has decided to move these meetings over into the former Turner Valley Council Chambers (at 514 Windsor Avenue NW) beginning in April or May. This is being done to provide extra space for Council, administration, and members of the public to view the meetings more comfortably. This will also potentially accommodate additional office space in the main office.

Efforts are underway to designate an off-leash dog park west of the water treatment plant at the end of Okalta Drive. Work will begin on enhancing the parking area in the spring, and fencing will start once the frost is out of the ground. There have been many concerns raised about responsible pet management and the need to control pets. Please remember to respect your neighbours and clean up after your pets, and keep them leashed unless you are in an off-leash space. Also, remember that feeding wildlife, including deer, is not permitted.

The Alberta Summer Games will be hosted by the towns of Okotoks and Diamond Valley this summer from July 20-23. Volunteers are still needed, and you can sign up at <https://albertasummergames.ca/>. Diamond Valley is responsible for the mountain bike event, and we still have work to complete on the trail before we invite the province to our beautiful town. The event is expected to draw thousands of visitors to our region, and this will be an excellent opportunity to demonstrate not only our commitment to Alberta athletes and sport, but to showcase our wonderful businesses and community hospitality as well.

Thank you to all our residents and businesses for bearing with us as we iron out the kinks in our newly amalgamated systems. We're getting there, and we sure appreciate your patience!
